Klinik

Debbie provided an in-depth response to a wide range of questions.

New system working well.

Appointments are based on medical need and triaged by a clinician

In the recent survey 66% rated it good or excellent.

Confident that once most patients have used it will do so again

- Calls reducing from 1900 per week to around 1200
- Still working through some tweaks and changes
- GPs feel their clinics are more appropriate
- GPs prefer requests that come direct from patients / carers
- Most patients called back on the day and booked timely appt with clinician of choice or appropriate clinician
- Some patients still quite resistant
- 4 complaints via email responded to with rationale for change
- Appointments are based on need and triaged by a clinician
- Some patients not picking up calls / texts after they request
- Staff feel supported clinical need is not their responsibility

Survey

Initial top line results

- 235 responses 78% PPG members
- Bias towards older patients compared to 2023
- NHS still most popular App
- Of 75 people using Klinik split approx. 48% rated good
- 42 comments on Klinik mostly negative from elderly
- · Satisfaction on quality of appointments continues good
- · Few comments from people having trouble adjusting to a new GP or unable to see chosen GP
